We are very pleased to announce the signing of Paul Lewis. He needs no introduction, and we cannot wait to see him performing for Dolgellau this season.





Heb os, Cwpan JD Cymru yw'r gystadleuaeth bêldroed bwysicaf yng Nghymru. A bydd timau ym mhyramid pêl-droed Cymru yn cystadlu am y gwpan hardd yma'n flynyddol.

Trefnwyr y gystadleuaeth yw Cymdeithas Bêl-droed Cymru ac fe gynhaliwyd yn flynyddol ers 1877-18 ar

wahân i gyfnodau'r Rhyfeloedd Byd a phandemig Covid-19.

Sefydlwyd y Gymdeithas Bêl-droed yn Wrecsam yn 1876 a thimau o'r gogledd oedd yn lwyddiannus yn y gystadleuaeth am flynyddoedd. Dim ond yn 1912 enillodd Dinas Caerdydd y gystadleuaeth am y tro cyntaf fel tîm o'r de.

Bydd enillydd y Gwpan yn mynd ymlaen i gynrychioli Cymru yng nghystadleuaeth Cynghrair Europa Conference. Noddir y gwpan gan gwmni JD Sports

Hyd at 1995 gwahoddwyd timau o Gymru a Lloegr a chwaraeai yng Nghynghreiriau Lloegr i gymryd rhan yn y gystadleuaeth ac enillwyd y Gwpan ar sawl achlysur gan dim o'r ochr arall i'r ffin. Enghreifftiau o hyn yw bod enwau Crew Alexandra, Amwythig, Caer a Henffordd ar y Gwpan. Ni chaniatawyd i'r clybiau yma fynd ymlaen i gynrychioli Cymru yn Ewrop wrth gwrs.

Ers 1996 dim ond timau sy'n chwarae yng Nghynghreiriau Cymru sy'n cael cystadlu am y Gwpan. Golygai hyn na chai Caerdydd, Abertawe, Wrecsam a Chasnewydd gystadlu. Ond hefyd Merthyr Town a tan llynedd Bae Colwyn..

The **FAW Welsh Cup** is a knock-out football competition contested annually by teams in the Welsh football league system. It is considered the most prestigious of the cup competitions in domestic Welshassociation football.

The Football Association of Wales (FAW) is the organising body of this competition, which has been run (except during the two World Wars and the Covid-19 pandemic) every year since its inception in 1877–78.^[1]

The FAW was founded in Wrexham in 1876, and Wrexham remained the site of the FAW's head office until 1986; it was not until 1912 that a southern team, Cardiff City, won the Welsh Cup for the first time.

The winning team qualifies to play in the following season's. Currently, the full sponsored name of the competition is the **JD Welsh Cup**.

Until 1995, Welsh clubs playing in the Welsh or English leagues were invited to play in the Welsh Cup. On occasion some English clubs, mostly teams from border areas (for example, Chester City, Crewe Alexandra, Hereford United and Shrewsbury Town), were also invited to participate. However, in the event of an English club winning the Welsh Cup, they were not allowed to progress to the European Cup Winners' Cup. Instead, the best placed Welsh club in the Welsh Cup competition would take the European place.

From 1996 to 2011, only clubs playing in the Welsh football league system were allowed to enter the Welsh Cup. This rule excluded the six Welsh clubs who played in the English football league system: Cardiff City, Colwyn Bay, Merthyr Town, Newport County, Swansea City and Wrexham. On 20 April 2011, the Football Association of Wales invited these six clubs to rejoin the Welsh Cup for the 2011–12 season, but only Merthyr Town, Newport County and Wrexham accepted.



Croeso i'n gwrthwynebwyr Llandrindod Wells

Llandrindod Wells was formed in November 1883, with five players from the Lewis family taking the field. In 1897-98 the club won the South Wales Junior Cup, with an exciting crop of players. One of the early stars was Jeff Jones who played for Llandrindod from 1904-1906 before signing for Aston Villa, going on to win 3 caps for Wales. He then played for Northern Nomads before returning to play for Llandrindod until the outbreak of WW1, where he joined the Medical Corps in WW1. In 1918 he was reported as missing in action but had been captured by the Germans and survived to live to the ripe old age of 90.

Carl Robinson is another former player, who went onto play 52 times for Wales, as well as make over 300 league appearances for Wolves, Sunderland and Norwich.



In the last 40 years Llandrindod have played predominately in the Mid-Wales League apart from 5 seasons in the Cymru Alliance. 1993-94 saw them finish runners up in the Mid-Wales League to win promotion to the Cymru Alliance, where they finished in 7th place in their first season. They played a further 3 seasons at this level before dropping back into the Mid-Wales League in 1997-98.

2009-10 season saw Llandrindod win the Emrys Morgan Cup by beating Montgomery 1–0. 2010–2011 season was to also bring success, with the club finishing in 4th place, in the Mid-Wales League Division 2, behind winners Aberaeron, Four Crosses and Llanfair United. The season ended with cup success, defeating Hay St Marys to win the Radnorshire Cup at Builth Wells.

The following season 2012–2013, Llandrindod had a very good start, going undefeated in the first 10 games, but the side fell away after Christmas and finished the season as runners up to winners Llanfair United. Both clubs were promoted to the Mid-Wales League Division 1 for the 2013–14 season.

2013–14 was to be even better for Llandrindod when they won the first 16 games of the season. This included an opening day 8–1 away win at local rivals Builth Wells and a further win away at Montgomery 13–0. The team went on to maintain their form enough over the season to win the Mid-Wales League Division 1, finishing with 22 wins and a draw out of 28 games. The team remained undefeated at home in the league, only dropping 2 points. The season culminated in a must-win last day victory over Montgomery Town with a 3–1 scoreline securing the league and in the process took the team to 101 goals, whilst also conceding just 27 goals. Llandrindod Wells had won the league for the first time in 47 years. Of the whole squad, at least 15 players had played at junior and youth level for the club.

After ground improvements in the new year of 2014, the club met the ground criteria for a return to the Cymru Alliance. The club then spent the following four seasons in the Mid-Wales League Division 1, with Llandrindod Wells best finish, 6th place in 2015-16 season.
